*The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of London enacts as follows:*

#### **SHORT TITLE SNOWMOBILE BY-LAW**

##### **Part 1 DEFINITIONS**

- 1.1 **Definitions**  
In this by-law:

##### **Highway – defined**

“highway” includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle designated and intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles.

##### **Motorized snow vehicle – defined**

“motorized snow vehicle” shall mean a self-propelled vehicle designated to be driven exclusively on snow or ice or both.

### **Shoulder – defined**

“shoulder” shall mean that portion of every street which abuts the roadway and which is designated and intended for the passage or stopping of motor vehicles but which extends no more than twelve feet in width from the limit of the roadway.

## **Part 2 GENERAL PROHIBITION**

### **2.1 Driving – on – over highway – prohibited – exceptions**

No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicle along or across any highway or part of a highway within the City of London except as provided in Part 3 of this by-law.

## **Part 3 EXCEPTIONS**

### **3.1 Crossing of highways – compliance – Regulation 804**

The driver of a motorized snow vehicle about to cross a highway from property abutting the highway shall do so in compliance with subsection 5(1) and 5(2) of Regulation 804 R.R.O. 1990 as amended from time to time.

### **3.2 Road shoulder – use – for loading – unloading**

The driver of a motorized snow vehicle may use the shoulder of the highway to load or unload the motorized snow vehicle from or onto its trailer or tow vehicle, but shall not operate the vehicle upon the highway for a longer period of time than is reasonably necessary to complete the loading or unloading operation.

## **Part 4 ENFORCEMENT**

### **4.1 Fine – for contravention**

Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is, upon conviction, guilty of an offence and is liable to any penalty as provided in the *Provincial Offences Act*.

### **4.2 Continuation – repetition – prohibited – by order**

The court in which the conviction has been entered, and any court of competent jurisdiction thereafter, may make an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the person convicted, and such order shall be in addition to any other penalty imposed on the person convicted.

## **Part 5 REPEAL – ENACTMENT**

### **5.1 By-law – previous**

By-law P.S.-102-188 is hereby repealed.

### **5.2 Effective date**

This by-law comes into force on May 15, 1994.
