



**PEDESTRIAN RECREATIONAL PATHWAY CROSSING OF RICHMOND STREET
MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT
NOTICE OF PROJECT INFORMATION CENTRE #1**

The City of London has retained AECOM to undertake a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to evaluate alternative solutions and design alternatives for a pedestrian/cyclist crossing of Richmond Street north of Sunningdale Road and associated pathway alignment.

The first of two Public Information Centres (PIC) is scheduled for **Wednesday November 12, 2014 at Mother Teresa Catholic Secondary School, 1065 Sunningdale Road East from 4:30 pm to 7:30 pm.** This meeting will detail the purpose and scope of the project, confirm the project need, and identify alternatives and any further issues or concerns to be addressed. Members of the public are encouraged to attend and provide comments specific to the project. The project team will be available to answer questions and provide information related to the project. This meeting will be an open house format with no formal presentation being made.

A second PIC will be held at a future date to present the alternative design concepts; provide an overview of their related advantages and disadvantages; identify a preliminary preferred design alternative and recommendations as well as identify any mitigating measures to be implemented as part of the design. Once the alternatives and recommendations have been reviewed with interested parties, an Environmental Study Report (ESR) will be prepared to document all of the stages of the study. This document will be submitted to the Ministry of Environment and will be available for public review for a period of 30 calendar days.

Comments and information regarding this project are being collected to assist in meeting the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act. This material will be maintained on file for use during the project and will become part of the public record, with the exception of personal information. Comments received will be used in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.
