What is Proposed?

Official Plan and Zoning amendments to allow:

- A site-specific amendment to the Shopping Area Place Type policies to include light industrial uses, such as warehousing/distribution, self storage and craft brewing, in addition to the existing uses.
- To modify the existing Associated Shopping Area (ASA) Zone on a site-specific basis to include light industrial uses.
- To modify the zoning on the former Costco lands to match the amended zoning on the rest of the subject lands.

Application Details

Requested Amendment to The London Plan (New Official Plan)

To amend the Shopping Area Place Type policies on a site-specific basis to permit Light Industrial uses such as warehousing, self-storage, and craft brewing, in addition to the existing uses.

Requested Zoning By-law Amendment

To change the zoning from an Associated Shopping Area (ASA3/ASA5/ASA6(3)/ASA7(1)/ASA8(11)) Zone to a site specific (ASA3()*ASA5()*ASA6(3)()*ASA7(1)()*ASA8(11)()*) Zone to permit light industrial uses including warehousing, self-storage and craft brewing. Changes to the currently permitted land uses and development regulations are summarized below.

Current Zoning

Zone: Associated Shopping Area (ASA3/ASA5/ASA6(3)/ASA7(1)/ASA8(11)) Zone

Permitted Uses: ASA3 [clinics, day care centres, laboratories, medical/dental offices, offices professional, offices service; ASA5: automobile repair garages, automotive uses, restaurants, taxi establishments; ASA7: cinemas; ASA8: uses permitted in the ASA1 & ASA2 Zone variation

Height: 12 metres

Requested Zoning

Zone: (ASA3()*ASA5()*ASA6(3)()* ASA7(1)()*ASA8(11)()*)

Permitted Uses: The above listed uses in the ASA3, ASA5, ASA6(3), ASA7(1) and ASA8(11) zones.

Special Provision(s): Additional permitted uses: uses permitted under the Light Industrial (LI6) and (LI10) Zone including any uses permitted in the LI1 Zone variation, LI2 Zone variation, building or contracting establishments, storage depots, terminal centres, transport terminals, self-storage establishments, bakeries, business service establishments, manufacturing and assembly industries, offices support, paper and allied products industrial, pharmaceutical and medical product industries, printing, reproduction and data processing industries, research and development establishments, warehouse establishments, wholesale establishments, custom workshop, service trade, existing self-storage establishments, artisan workshop, craft brewery, tow truck business, food tobacco and beverage processing industries excluding meat packaging, leather and fur processing excluding tanning, service trades and textile processing industries.

Height: 12 metres.

The City may also consider additional special provisions.

Planning Policies

Any change to the Zoning By-law must conform to the policies of the Official Plan, London's long-range planning document. The subject lands are in the Shopping Area Place Type in The London Plan, permitting a broad range of retail, service, office, entertainment, recreational, educational, institutional and residential uses.

The subject lands are also in the Southwest Area Secondary Plan (SWAP), and form part of the Wellington Road/Highway 401 Neighbourhood, designated as Commercial Land Use.

How Can You Participate in the Planning Process?

You have received this Notice because someone has applied to change the Official Plan designation and the zoning of land located within 120 metres of a property you own, or your landlord has posted the public meeting notice in your building. The City reviews and makes decisions on such planning applications in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act. If you previously provided written or verbal comments about this application, we have considered your comments as part of our review of the application and in the preparation of the planning report and recommendation to the Planning and Environment Committee. The additional ways you can participate in the City's planning review and decision making process are summarized below.

The Planning and Environment Committee will consider the requested Official Plan and zoning changes at this meeting, which is required by the Planning Act. You will be invited to provide your comments at this public participation meeting. A neighbourhood or community association may exist in your area. If it reflects your views on this application, you may wish to select a representative of the association to speak on your behalf at the public participation meeting. Neighbourhood Associations are listed on the [Neighbourgood](#) website. The Planning and Environment Committee will make a recommendation to Council, which will make its decision at a future Council meeting.

What Are Your Legal Rights?

Notification of Council Decision

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of London on the proposed official plan amendment and/or zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, 300 Dufferin Ave., P.O. Box 5035, London, ON, N6A 4L9, or at docservices@london.ca. You will also be notified if you speak to the Planning and Environment Committee at the public meeting about this application and leave your name and address with the Clerk of the Committee.

Right to Appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the proposed official plan amendment is adopted, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the proposed official plan amendment is adopted, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

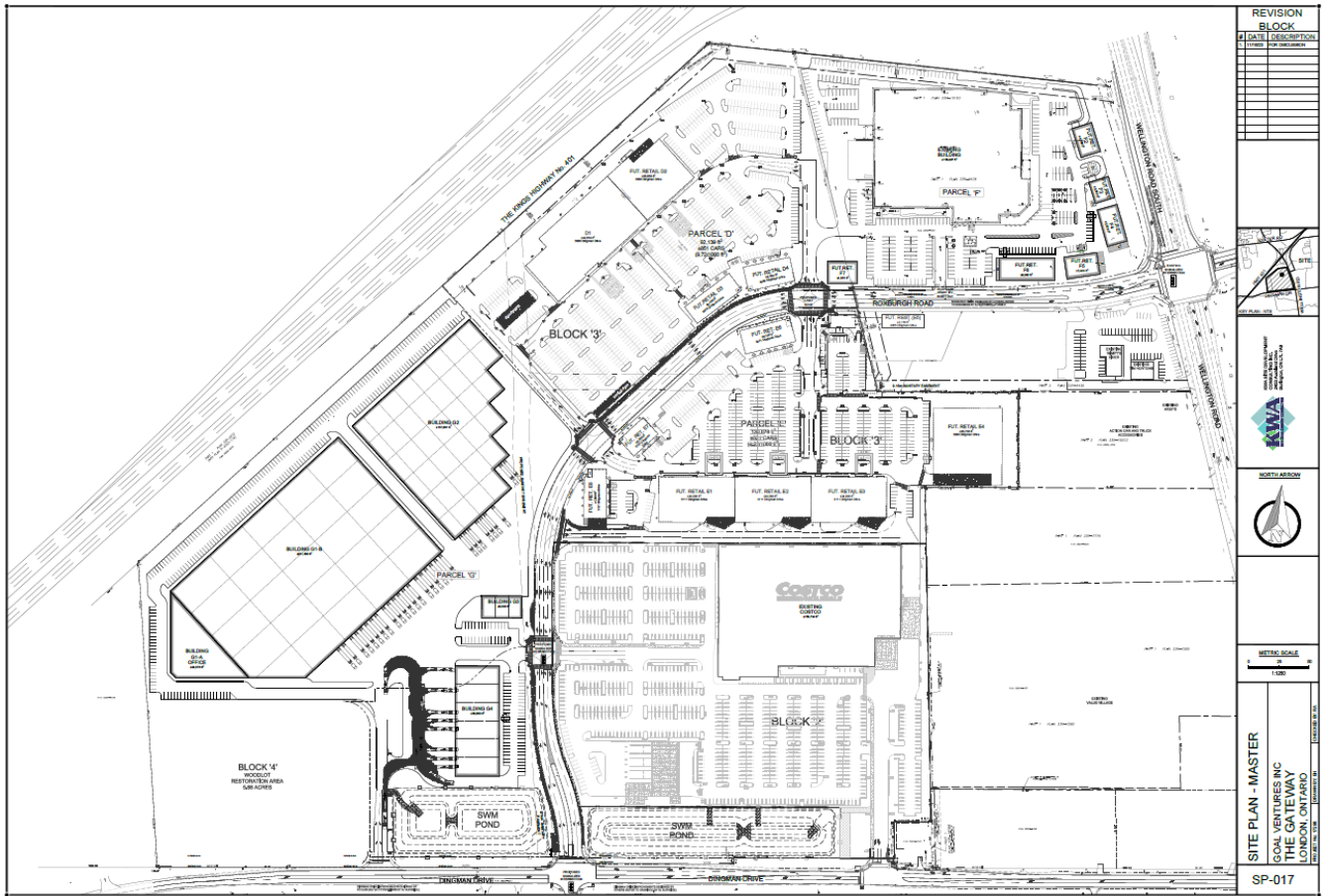
Notice of Collection of Personal Information
