Zoning By-Law Amendment

Applicant: City of London

What is Proposed?

The "General Purpose" sections of the Zoning By-law include references to where the Zones would be used. The London Plan uses different names and descriptions for land uses. This change would add the name used in The London Plan to the Zoning By-law.

Possible Amendments to the "General Purpose" Sections of the Zoning By-law (subsections 5.1 to 51.1) to:

- Delete references to the specific land use designations of the Official Plan (1989) and replace them with the specific Place Types of The London Plan (the City's new Official Plan) for each zone in the Zoning By-law.
- Council may also consider removing any references to specific land use designations from the Zoning By-law.

Requested Zoning By-law Amendment

Possible amendment to the "General Purpose" subsections of Zoning By-law Z.-1 (subsections from 5.1 to 51.1) to **DELETE** the references to the specific land use designations of the Official Plan (1989) that are intended to be implemented by the respective Zone. Possible amendment to the "General Purpose" subsections to **ADD** the specific Place Types of the new Official Plan (*The London Plan*) that will be implemented by the respective Zone.

Planning Policies

Any change to the Zoning By-law must conform to the policies of the Official Plan, London's long-range planning document. There are no proposed changes to *London Plan* Place Types as part of this Zoning Application.

We are inviting your comments on the requested changes at this time so that we can consider them as we review the application and prepare a report that will include Planning Services staff's recommendation to the City's Planning and Environment Committee.

Attend a Future Public Participation Meeting

The Planning and Environment Committee will consider the requested zoning changes on a date that has not yet been scheduled. The City will send you another notice inviting you to attend this meeting, which is required by the *Planning Act*. You will also be invited to provide your comments at this public participation meeting. The Planning and Environment Committee will make a recommendation to Council, which will make its decision at a future Council meeting.

What Are Your Legal Rights?

Notification of Council Decision

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of London on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, 300 Dufferin Ave., P.O. Box 5035, London, ON, N6A 4L9, or at docservices@london.ca. You will also be notified if you speak to the Planning and Environment Committee at the public meeting about this application and leave your name and address with the Secretary of the Committee.

Right to Appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.
